



HOW TO FIND WOOD & DOUGLAS LTD

The following instructions are from the M3 Motorway and also the M4. Travelling time by car from key landmarks are as follows :

M4 Junction 12	-	20 minutes
M3 Junction 6	-	20 minutes
M3/M25 Junction at Chertsey	-	50 minutes
M4/M25 Junction at Heathrow	-	50 minutes
Heathrow Airport	-	60 minutes
Reading Railway Station	-	20 minutes
(Theale Railway Station)	-	15 minutes
Basingstoke Railway Station	-	20 minutes

Note if using Sat Nav you should enter **RG26 5LL** as our postcode as this more accurate.

FROM THE M3 (Junction 6)

Exit the M3 at Junction 6 (Basingstoke) and follow the signs to Basingstoke. This is along dual carriageway on the north side of the M3. At the next roundabout (Black Dam) go straight across (second exit) onto the ring road heading north. This is also dual carriageway but keep in the middle or outside lane.

Follow the ring road passing two exits, the second one being the A33 Reading road.

Take the next exit slip road after the A33 signposted to District Hospital/Aldermaston A340 (approx 1mile). This drops down to a roundabout under the ringway. Take the 4th exit from the roundabout (first one after you pass underneath). Immediately there is a set of traffic. Go straight across at these lights. The Hospital will be seen on the far left.

Follow the A340 for about 5 miles passing through Sherborne St John, and Pamber Green.

Continue on this road until you reach Tadley, proceed up and then down the hill where you reach a roundabout with the new swimming pool off to the left.

Turn left at this roundabout into New Road towards the pool. This is signposted Baughurst and Public Golf Course. Pass Reading Warehouse on the right and at the end of New Road beware the sharp right-hand bend (not straight on as the visible road would suggest !). The golf course will soon be seen on the right through the trees. Follow this road without taking any side turns until a "T" junction is reached. (There is a sharp left hand turn on this road near the golf course.) At the T junction turn right into Baughurst Road. There is a telephone box on the right-hand side at this junction.

Follow Baughurst Road for 800 metres and you will see Lattice House with its distinctive curved roof and truss work on the left hand side. It is along a row of domestic properties bordering the road and is behind a new brick wall with large red iron lattice gates and with a slate name plate.

(If you reach the Badgers Wood public house you have gone too far).

Turn in through the gates and park either in the visitors spaces at the front or in the extra parking spaces at the rear.

Wood & Douglas reception is through the left hand side door at the front of Lattice House.



FROM THE M4 (Junction 12)

Exit the M4 at Junction 12 (Reading West, Theale).

Take the A4 towards Newbury and go straight on through the first roundabout (second exit). Take the second exit at the second roundabout signposted A4 Newbury & A340 Basingstoke.

After 4 miles, at the end of a stretch of dual carriageway you will come to a roundabout. Take the first exit onto the A340 signposted Aldermaston/ Tadley/Basingstoke. Pass over the railway bridge and then watch for traffic on the canal bridge. You have priority on the bridge.

Follow the A340 up through Aldermaston village (approx 2 miles). The road bears right at the top of the village street. (Beware the speed camera half way up the street on the left hand side and on your return there is one just as you enter the village coming back down the hill).

The road climbs upwards. At the top of the hill there is Young's Industrial Estate on the right. Note that our Surface Mount Technology Centre is located in Unit 2 of Youngs. Immediately after the entrance to Youngs there is a roundabout with an entrance to AWE to the left.

Continue along the A340 passing a second roundabout into AWE and then a roundabout with Calleva Industrial Park on the right hand side. You will see our publicity boards on this roundabout.

Go straight across at this roundabout (second exit) into Heath End Road. This terminates in a "T" junction with Baughurst Road to the left and Brimpton Road to the right. The Badgers Wood public house is more or less opposite. Turn left into Baughurst Road where you will pass the War Memorial on your left.

Continue down Baughurst Road for 400 metres and you will see Lattice House with its distinctive curved roof and truss work on the right hand side behind a new brick wall with large red iron lattice gates. Turn into the gates and park either in the visitors spaces at the front of the building or in the extra parking area at the rear of the building.

Wood & Douglas reception is through the left hand side door at the front of Lattice House.

OTHER DETAILS

Rail Services

The three nearest towns are Reading, Basingstoke and Newbury. All three have main line railway services from London. Reading and Newbury are on the West Country line from London Paddington Station. The service to Reading is the fastest and most frequent and an express train takes under 30 minutes. Basingstoke is served by London Waterloo Station and takes 50 minutes by express. Both stations have taxi services. Reading has the faster and more regular rail services but is the most difficult because of road traffic to get in and out of for pick up and set down purposes. Connections through to Theale (change at Reading) are less frequent but easier access from Lattice House.

London Heathrow Airport

There is a Rail-Air link service from London Heathrow (LHR) to Reading Railway Station. This service runs hourly and takes approximately 50 minutes door to door. It picks up at all five LHR terminals. At the moment there is no easier method of getting to Reading direct from LHR. The alternative is to take the Underground or the new Heathrow Express into London and then transfer to rail for either Reading or Basingstoke
